The Basics

- Handbell ringers are ringing the same methods
- But thinking in a different way
- Requires lots of practice, just like tower bells
- There is a handstroke and a backstroke
- One change per stroke, as with tower bell ringing



Note – these guys are the crème de la crème!




The Negatives

- Not as sociable
- Lacks the physical activity
- You don't get to visit lots of nice places
- Don't often go to pub afterwards
- It's only really about change ringing
- You have to ring two each!!

The Positives

- You can do it sitting down
- You don't have to leave home
- You only need to find half as many people
- No need to go to church
- Easier to achieve high standard

The 1-2 position






Putting it together: Plain Bob Minor

- 1-2 position
- 2-3 position
- 3-4 position



What makes it harder?

- Rhythm of the bell swing doesn't help you
- Two bells almost always go wrong together
- Harder to conduct
- Concentration more intense

What makes it easier?

- Just thinking about relative positions
- Don't actually need to learn two blue lines
- Don't have to worry about actually ringing a bell
- Not dealing with relative size issue or ropesight
